This is what Presbyterian missionary John Goheen said about his farm work during the 1930s in India. This type of mission work began in 1903, when Presbyterian missionary Samuel Higginbottom started a small farm school. His school taught scientific methods to Indian farmers and later grew to become the Allahabad Institute. Soon many other new schools were created such as Arthur Slater's chicken farm school. All of these projects helped grow more food so that people in the villages would not be hungry. This year we celebrate Heritage Sunday with the theme: "The Earth is the Lord's and All Those Who Live in It" (Psalm 24:1). Mission work is one way Presbyterians show God's love for the people of the earth.
